COVID-19 Re-Opening Plan

CDC Guidelines, Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation Guidelines and Waukesha County Guidelines were considered for the development of this plan. Plan components are subject to change at any time based on new information from these sources. This includes restricting or expanding guidelines for the safety of facility users. We encourage our park users to maintain proper social distancing of 6 feet while using facilities, be respectful to others, and enjoy the great outdoors! All facilities should be used at your own risk.

- Playgrounds – Open
- Skate Park – Open
- Restrooms and Portable Toilets – Open
- Tennis Courts – Public Park courts are open. Elmbrook School District courts are closed through June 30 (currently being reviewed by Board of Education). Staff will contact league permit holders directly to establish start dates for league play.
- Pickleball Courts – Open. Nets and equipment will not be provided by the City. City pickleball program will begin in July.
- Volleyball Courts – Open. Staff will contact league permit holders directly to establish start dates for league play.
- Baseball / Softball – The City will be providing permitted local organizations specific permit conditions for the use of fields. Elmbrook School District facilities are closed through June 30 and not available for use (currently being reviewed by Board of Education).
- Multi-Purpose Athletic Fields (Soccer, Football, Rugby, Lacrosse) – Team activity including practices and games are not permitted at this time. Guidelines and phasing plans in development process.
- Recreation Programs – class / group size limited to meet social distancing requirements.
 - June 1 Activity Guide available on City web site
 - June 15 Online program registration begins at 8:00 a.m.
 - July 6 Programs begin as scheduled in the activity guide
- Picnic Areas, Pavilions & Shelters – Capacity levels for each facility have been adjusted to meet social distancing requirements. Permit holders will be contacted by department staff to provide options for holding or cancelling a reservation. Group size must be 50 or less or meet new capacity limits. Capacity will be re-evaluated as we move through the summer.
